Special Notice — A Dues Holiday for 2021

Due to the COVID pandemic many LMYA events had to be cancelled including our regular rendezvous and open houses. Some of our members were not able to launch their boats and others were not able to go cruising and use their LMYA Cruising Cards. At the recent annual meeting of the LMYA a

new dues level was proposed and approved for 2021 to take the reduced services in 2020 into account. For the 2021 calendar year, a dues holiday has been approved so that Sustaining Members dues will be dropped from \$45 to **\$30** (a 1/3 reduction.) Likewise, Club Mem-

bership dues will also be dropped by 1/3 from \$150 per year to just **\$100**. Your membership renewal letters will be sent in early January reflecting these new lower dues levels. Dues in the future years will be determined at the end of 2021. The LMYA is determined to get back to our

regular pattern of social events as soon as it is practical and safe to do so. We are also committed to keeping up our Cruising Card program each year for those of you who want to venture out and visit different marinas and yacht clubs around our great lake.

South Shore Yacht Club – Breakwater Update

The FEMA determination letter that was eagerly anticipated has arrived and the answer from FEMA was no. There will be no federal funding for repairing the damages to the breakwater that occurred in the storms of las January. As a result, Milwaukee County is making plans to do its own funding of the project to begin in 2021

with hopes of completing the project in 2022. It is a very major undertaking as the original breakwater installed in the 1930’s has finally been damaged to the point of needing a complete rebuild from the high lake levels and severe storm damage. South Shore is considering helping with the initial phase which would ne needed to

provide a secure harbor area for their C and D docks.

South Shore was not able to repair all its finger piers this season, and only repaired the structural steel damage around its horseshoe area. Rebuilding the finger piers involves constructing about 950

four-foot sections of wooden pallets that are affixed to the steel supports. Some of the members will begin to construct these wooden pallets over the winter in hopes that the breakwater gaps can be filled by the county early next spring.

Lock and Dams on Illinois River

The locks and dams along the Illinois River are now open. Starved Rock and Marseilles locks are now completed and Dresden Island is partially opened. Work on Brandon Road will begin in 2021. Peoria Lock is in the Hold Open position due to the high water levels.
